

Reopening Public Mass

Attending Public Mass



- Seating in church will be very limited due to social distancing measures of 10% of the maximum capacity
- There will be designated entries to the church as well as designated exits
- Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with national, state and local health directives. All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church
- Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass

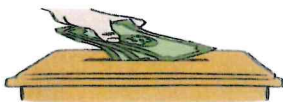

Masks

- The faithful are obliged to wear masks in church, except while in the pews
- Please bring your mask from home. "I wear my mask to protect you from me in case I am unknowingly carrying the virus." It is act of love to wear a mask
- If you come to church without mask, you will be asked to leave

Collection



- The collection baskets will not be placed. A box will be made available where you will be able to drop off your contributions



During Mass

- Families will sit at least 6 feet away from other families to ensure social distancing
- Please do not sit at the end of the pew, rather at least 4 feet in from the end to allow social distancing from the communion lines
- Hymnals and missalettes have been removed
- You may bring your own missal, Magnificat or other worship aid
- Procession of the Gifts is suspended until further notice



Hand sanitizer will be provided by the church, but feel free to bring your own hand sanitizer

During Mass - Communion

- To approach the sanctuary to receive Holy Communion, please form two lines, one at each side of the church
- Please stand at least 6 feet behind the family in front of you. In church, there will be tape to mark off 6 feet between families
- Keep gloves and mask on while standing in the line and while receiving the Holy Communion

After Mass

- When Mass is over, you will be dismissed by one pew at a time rather than everyone filling out at once. This will prevent bunching up of people
- When you leave, please proceed directly to the exit. Sadly, this cannot be a time to visit inside
- Bulletins will be placed under the windshield wipers of parishioners' cars, and are also posted on our web site
